Doing any one of these steps is a big help in our operation. Why not make it a monthly family affair? Our Food Pantry makes up about 2 dozen food parcels each month for local families in need of assistance. The sizes of the families vary from 1 person to households of 7 or more. These food baskets are considered a four day "emergency" food supply to help them get through a difficult, temporary time. Many times families facing unforeseen circumstances cut back on grocery shopping in an effort to make ends meet.



ENVELOPE OFFERING & E GIVING goes into the line item YOU indicate on YOUR envelope (or online for E Giving). (Unified, Mortgage, 2nd Mile Mission, Improvements or Other). Money is accounted for as YOU designate. In other words, if you indicate "Unified" on your envelope, that money will be used **only** for the general expenses of the church. If you indicate "Mortgage", that money will be used **only** towards the monthly mortgage payment. Any other designations (such as 2nd Mile Missions, Improvements, flowers, VBS, youth, ballfield, Garden, etc.) will be accounted for separately and used **only** for the purpose you have indicated.

If you make NO designation on your envelope, your offering goes into the Unified Account towards the general expenses of the church.

LOOSE OFFERING (money not in an envelope) goes into the Unified Account towards the general expenses of the church.
