- 7. low-sodium soups
- 8. canned tuna and canned chicken in water
- 9. brown rice. quinoa.
- 10. nuts and seeds, unsalted
- 11. shelf stable milk and milk substitutes
- 12. whole grain pasta
- 13. low-sodium pasta sauce
- 14. popcorn kernels (not microwave popcorn)
- 15. canned stews
- 16. unsweetened apple sauce
- 17. whole grain, low-sugar cold cereals
- 18. olive or canola oil
